

EMMAUS HELSINKI RY WAS FOUNDED in 1966 as part of the international Emmaus movement, which calls upon all kinds of people – skilled and unskilled – to work together to help the less fortunate and to support them in their struggle for human rights and a better life. Politically and religiously non-aligned, Emmaus is also an environmental movement, which promotes recycling and a sustainable lifestyle.

THE MAIN EVENT for the Emmaus movement in 2019 was the 70th anniversary, which we celebrated in November in Helsinki by organising an open day. Seventy years ago the Parisian priest and member of parliament, Abbé Pierre, invited a suicidal ex-convict to join him to help families made homeless by the Second World War, and thus the Emmaus movement was born.

In May Emmaus international celebrated the 50th anniversary of the Emmaus manifesto in Bern, Switzerland, where we were also represented.

In September 2019 we held a workshop for our members with the title "Values and Actions", to consider the motives and meaning of our work. Our solidarity themes in 2019 were among others the right to

clean water, the right to a home, human rights, International Romani Day, and the rights of women, children and the physically challenged.

Emmaus Helsinki's fundraising is mainly from its two fleamarkets, which sell items donated by members of the public. Most of the work is done by volunteers, which enables us to channel a large part of the profits to solidarity work at home and abroad. In 2019 there was a total of 83 volunteers working almost 300 hours per week. Salaried employees comprised the executive manager, two part-time shop managers, one part time shop assistant and one part-time odd-job man. Additionally we employed students and people finding their way in working life.

One of our main concerns has been the fact that the Lauttasaari fleamarket building will be pulled down. We are actively looking for alternative premises in Lauttasaari.

IN EMMAUS HELSINKI RY MATTERS are decided in a general meeting (170 members) in spring and autumn, and by the board chosen in a general meeting (chair: Ulla Hoyer, and 11 other members) who met nine times during the course of the year.

Our publication "Emmaus Uutiset" which came out twice, in the spring and the autumn, was sent to members and also made available for customers to read in our shops. Weekly updates were emailed to members, and we made regular updates to our Facebook and Instagram pages. In the Vallila shop we have an exhibition window, where artists and cooperation partners present current topics on a monthly basis.

OUR WORK IN 2019 CLOSELY FOLLOWED OUR ACTION PLAN. We achieved our target to donate 35% of our sales income to solidarity work at home and abroad.

Our fleamarkets' combined sales income was €346,484. The Lauttasaari shop's sales exceeded Vallila's for the first time. We were able to channel €120,776 to monetary donations.




